



Homeowner's Association Meeting**

Date: February 5th, 2026

Location: SRPE Clubhouse, 979 Edgebrook Drive N., Toms River, NJ 08757

Time: 7:00 pm – 10 residents in attendance.

- I. **Call to Order:** President Phil Cupo called the meeting to order at 7:10 pm
- II. **Roll Call of Trustees:** Present: Darlene DeGennaro, Susan Swain, James Clarke, Kathy Conte, Mary Fiore, Dave Fuhrman, and Debbie Moriarty.
- III. **Pledge of Allegiance**
- IV. **Speaker** – Gerry Gavin, Director of Business Development and Adam Adelson, Chief Operating Officer of Senior Helpers, a provider of in-home care for Seniors
 - A. Gerry and Adam reviewed the various services offered by their organization. Qualified caregivers can be stationed at the clubhouse available for short-term requests allowing seniors to save money by paying only for the number of hours needed to perform them. They also offer longer term senior care. Their services include locating and securing available funding from outside organizations, depending on eligibility. Finally, they featured their "Town Square", located in Brick, offering activities, events and care services to seniors in a 50's style small town environment.
- V. **President's Announcements:**
 - A. Phil announced that the Hiring Committee has decided on a candidate for Office Manager to replace Olga Corpion. He said the candidate will meet with the Board at the upcoming Agenda Meeting for final approval. The outcome will be announced at the Annual Meeting on March 5th.
 - B. He also made an appeal to owners to volunteer, reminding everyone that our community is self-managed and without volunteers to help with daily maintenance tasks and improvements, the Board would be obliged to hire a handy man, which could result in an increase in quarterly dues.
- VI. **Approval of Meeting Minutes:** Motion to approve the Minutes of the January 8th 2026 Homeowner's meeting was made by Jim Clarke, seconded by Kathy Conte and passed unanimously.
- VII. **Approval of the Treasurer's report:** Treasurer Scott Stern announced that we are breaking even for the month. Motion to approve the Treasurer's report by Kathy Conte and seconded by Debbie Moriarty passed unanimously.
- VIII. **New Business:**
 - A. **Administrative Report:**
 1. **Real Estate:** Kathy reported 6 properties for sale, 8 under contract, 3 sold in the month of January.
 2. **Delinquent Accounts:** She announced \$6,500 in unpaid 4th quarter dues and \$2,430 in unpaid violations, processing fees and late fees, totaling \$8,930.
\$3,315 in late fees and delinquent dues were paid.
Liens continue on: Cambridge Ct for \$20,678.34; Chamberlain Drive for \$5,250.51, and Chancellor Court for \$14,587.54 for a total of \$40,516.39.
 - B. **Coalition Meeting Report:**
 1. Debbie reported that the Township requires that all vehicles be removed from the street during a snow storm. Plowing begins at 2 inches and use of front loaders at 5 inches. She said they begin plowing the main roads first. The department requests that homeowners call only when there is an emergency.
 2. She advised those who are on dialysis to call the mayor's office to get registered so that they may be helped to reach their providers during a storm. She said a form is available on the Coalition website for use by anyone needing essential services when they are unable to leave home.
 3. She reminded disabled owners to send a copy of the disability ID card provided with their automobile placard to Public Works to have them assist with their robo-cans since a doctor's note will no longer be accepted. They can be faxed, emailed or dropped off at Public Works.
 4. The Coalition web site, SCOFBT.ORG, alerts homeowners to an app called Recyclecoach available from the App Store that provides a wealth of information related to recycling and includes recycle pick-up schedules in your area. Other information about scheduled events in Berkeley Township communities and matters of interest to seniors is also available on the Coalition site.
 5. Construction is scheduled for Route 37 at Bimini Drive in preparation for proposed development on the 27 acres between the railroad tracks and Route 37. The plan includes a car dealership, a gas station, 99 townhouses and apartments, a restaurant and 2 playgrounds.
 6. Anchor PTR booklets are available on line and were mailed in the beginning of February.
 7. AARP is offering a free driving course which taken, could reduce automobile insurance rates considerably.
 8. Ocean County Community College is offering tax preparation assistance beginning February 5th.
 9. The Community Connection has been discontinued. The Coalition is partnering with Senior Publishing to see if they can provide a similar publication for homeowners.
 10. Future legislation is expected requiring communities to provide a copy of their reserve studies to potential new homeowners. The Assembly and the Senate are considering bills related to over 55 communities. One bill allows owners under the age of 55 to own homes in Over 55 communities, which has been the case in SRPE for some time provided the occupant is over the age of 55. The other is a law prohibiting Common Interest communities from charging a Capital Contribution upon homes transferred from individual owners to a trust.

IX. Motions:

A. Architectural Committee approvals:

Kathy made a motion to approve a fence at 1 York Court and a fence at 1155 Edgebrook Drive South. She also announced a pre-sale inspection passed at 1 Cambridge Court. Motion was seconded by Debbie Moriarty and passed unanimously.

- X. Section Reports:** Section 6 reported that the roads in his section were sanded. Section 9 reported that there was someone driving around the neighborhood in a bob cat after the storm offering to plow ice and snow from people's driveways free of charge.

XI. Club and Committee Reports:

A. Beautification: Debbie reported that the committee is considering replacing the flagpole because it is bent. She has quotes for removal and replacement from \$1,800 to \$4,800. The reserve study allows \$2,700.

B. Common Grounds and Trees: Dave reported that there are a number of pending tree requests plus requests to clean up the common grounds behind homes. Work is expected to resume after the snow has cleared.

C. Election Committee: It has been decided to accept ballots and Calls for Nominations by the latter of two dates stated in the Notice and in the Echo, February 6th. Currently the budget ballot has 100 yes votes and 2 no votes. The names of several candidates for positions on the Board of Trustees have been submitted. They need to be called to confirm their acceptance as nominees. Upon their acceptance, their names as well as names of those running for President will be listed on the two ballots to be mailed on February 18th and returned to the clubhouse by March 4th at 11am. There will be a Meet the Candidates night on February 18 at 7pm for all Association members to become acquainted with the candidates. Not in Good Standing letters have been mailed requiring owners to pay all outstanding charges by February 28th to have their votes counted.

D. Entertainment, Flea Market and Park Echo:

1. **Entertainment:** Gail announced Beginning balance at \$3,372.85. There were 4 events in 2025: Community Day, Hawaiian Luau, SRPE Picnic, and Holiday Dance. Total income: \$5,625.98. Subtract total expenditure: \$7,427.40. Ending balance as of December 31, 2025: \$1,571.43. For this year there are 4 scheduled events the first of which is the April Showers Dance on April 18 starting at 6pm. You are asked to call her to sign-up. This event is open to other communities. Cost pre-paid is \$12 or at the door will be \$15pp. The Committee would rather you prepay rather than at the door, due to limited space.

2. **Park Echo:** The March edition for handing in articles is now closed. If anyone has something they would like to add, it will be published in the April edition. FYI – Community Connection is no longer in production. If you want to see events happening in all the other communities visit SCofBT.org. Due to the snow/ice storm of last week, the committee decided it was not safe for our distributors or couriers to deliver door-to-door service. Sorry for the inconvenience, but you can pick up your Feb issue here in the vestibule and office. Deadline for the April issue is the first week of March.

3. **Flea Market:** Gail reported a beginning balance: \$4,194.03 with 3 events in 2025: Junk in the Trunk, Flea Market, and Craft Fair. Total income: \$1,527.50. Subtract total expenditure (which includes our donations): \$3,323.43. Ending balance as of December 31, 2025: \$2,398.10.

F. Exercise: Donna announced meetings Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays from 9:30 to 10:30Am.

G. Hospitality Committee: Linda announced that there are treats and coffee to be had after the meeting.

H. House: Three new programmable thermostats have been installed in the clubhouse and the office. The Fire Department now requires purchase of a "Knox Box" containing a key to the clubhouse for their use during an emergency. The device was ordered for a cost of \$574 and has been received. Dave has volunteered to install it.

I. Sunshine Club. Elva presented a report indicating that she sent out 5 Park Echos to former residents, 3 get well cards and 1 milestone birthday card. She continues to request a call when neighbors need a card. In response to an offer from the audience, she said she could use stamps.

- XII. Comments from the Membership:** One owner requested confirmation that only 100 budget ballots have been received. Debbie provided confirmation and the owner was surprised that such a small number of members have voted. One owner complained about the lack of lighting in the parking lot. Debbie answered that the problem is being addressed. Finally an owner commented that Tuesday Game night has been sparsely attended and encouraged owners to join the group.



THINGS TO BE AWARE OF WHEN SELLING YOUR PROPERTY

If there is not an approved Architectural Request on file for projects like fencing, decks, sheds, etc., you may be asked to remove them at any time, especially if you are going to sell your house.

The Architectural Committee performs a Pre-Sale Inspection when we are notified a house is put on the market. The Committee looks for things like decks (or any part of, including steps) and fences sticking out beyond the sidelines of the house, fences that are not open slated, rocks or mulch being used as a substitute for grass, work done to the front facade of the house without prior approval, etc.

Just because the problem has been there for years doesn't mean it will be "Grandfathered" and allowed to stay. If there is no prior written approval, it will have to be removed or modified.

If you have not made yourself familiar with what restrictions are in our Governing Documents (Covenants & Restrictions, By-Laws, and Rules & Regulations) please download a copy from our website (srpeast.com) in order to save yourself some headaches later.

SRPE Association Announcements - Ordinance, Covenants & Restrictions

Noise Limitations

- Non-commercial or non-industrial power tools, landscaping and yard maintenance equipment **shall not be operated** between the hours of 8 pm and 8 am.
Berkeley Township Ordinance 4-27.6 (b1)
- No work of noisy or obnoxious nature should be done on Sunday before 10 am and after 6 pm. Weekdays and Saturdays there is no noise before 8 am and after 8 pm except in case of severe emergency conditions approved by the Board of Trustees. **Contractors of any kind (landscapers, roofers, etc.) are prohibited on Sundays.**
Article 10, Section (u) of SRPE Covenants & Restrictions

SRPE Illegal Home Rentals

The Board has been informed repeatedly that some homeowners are renting their homes without notifying the Association – perhaps to avoid the \$300 fee, avoid age restrictions, or perhaps just plain unawareness.

This is a violation of our Covenants & Restrictions, which state that the Association must be notified before renting; the Tenant must be aged 55 or older; and a home cannot be rented unless you have lived in it for two years as a primary residence.

It is also a violation of Berkeley Township ordinances requiring the owner/landlord to register with the Township, provide an age-approval letter from the Association, and pay a Certificate of Occupancy (COO) inspection fee, total amount of \$95 (2 separate checks made out to Berkeley Township: one for \$55 and the other for \$40).

Fees from house rentals help keep our dues from increasing and help keep your taxes down. Most homeowners/landlords follow our C&R and Berkeley Township laws, but there are some who do not.

If you see someone moving into a house in our community, please call the office so we can verify that they have complied with these restrictions. The caller's name is always kept confidential.

Please Report Any Changes In Your Household

To keep information on our community current, please notify the Office if there are any changes in your household.

This is necessary for statistical HOPA purposes.

Typical changes would include:

- A new or additional phone number
- A homeowner has deceased or moved from the residence
- A change in occupancy, such as someone moving into or out of the residence
- Deed changes

ATTENTION Delinquent Homeowners

To bring severely delinquent accounts up to date, and upon the advice of the SRPE Attorney, please note the following:

If you are in arrears nine (9) months or longer with your dues payments, you must call the Administrative Secretary to make arrangements to bring your account up to date.

Failure to do so will result in a Lien being placed on your property. Court costs and attorney fees will be added to the amount in arrears. Ultimately you may face foreclosure proceedings on your home.

As of January 31, a total of \$49,446.39 are due. Out of that total: \$40,516.39 (3 liens); \$6,500.00 (65 residents unpaid dues); and \$2,430.00 (unpaid late fees, processing fees, and violations).

The Reserve-A-Ride program is primarily designed to serve routine medical needs of Ocean County residents. Unlike the Fixed Bus Routes, this service does not operate on the basis of a printed schedule, rather routes and pick-up times are developed each day in response to the service requests we receive. All vehicles are wheelchair lift equipped.

Once your reservation has been made, the driver will arrive anytime within 1 hour to 1½ hours of the scheduled appointment time (depending on your travel distance). In accordance with Ocean Ride's Safety Policy, our **Drivers are not permitted to enter your home**, thus we require that you be at ground level for your scheduled pick up.

Planning to Sell or Rent?

Read This First!

If you are a homeowner who is planning to put your home up for sale or rent, or if your home is currently for sale or rent without a realtor, you must contact the SRPE office immediately.

There are procedures, required by the Association and by Berkeley Township, that must be followed before a Closing of a Contract of Sale or Lease can take place.

- **Selling:** Article 11, Section 4 of our *Covenants & Restrictions* states, in part, that the owner of the property must notify the Association of the intended sale.
- **Renting/Leasing:** Article 10, Section(c) of our *Covenants & Restrictions* states that the owner of the property must notify the Association, in writing, that the prospective tenant meets the qualifications of membership in the Association.
- Berkeley Township requires a “**Continued Certificate of Occupancy**” (CO). Call the Berkeley Township Code Enforcement Office at (732) 244-7400, ext. 237, for more information.
